#### Claybrooke Magna Parish Council: Report to Internal Auditor Year 2018/19

A very challenging year due to 2 changes in the key administration and finance role of clerk.

Our long-standing clerk retired from April 2018 and was replaced by someone brand new to the role who, it transpired, did not have capacity to fulfil the role effectively. Councillors have worked hard individually and as a team to plug the inevitable gaps and to bring order to the disruption in our normally smooth—running affairs. By the year end the new clerk had left and the Council had appointed a replacement; early indications are extremely positive.

The various hand-overs and period of instability have impacted on record-keeping and it has been a challenge to extract all the necessary information for the year end. What can be said is that, during the year, financial propriety was maintained at all times through the exercise of key financial controls including:

- all payments had a supporting receipt/invoice
- were voted on at a Council meeting and recorded as such in the minutes
- payments were all by cheque with 2 authorised signatories
- precept expenditure was monitored and reported to PC meetings including regular reconciliations.

At date of writing, all invoices cannot be located but those for the highest expenditure asset purchases are available for inspection. Similarly the 'cash book' (Receipts/Expenses record) has had to be reconstructed using the cheque book and bank statements — no discrepancies found other a duplicate payment at the year end which has now been refunded.

Salaries were paid and managed by an external payroll service; due to the changes and issues identified above the final salary for our previous clerk was paid in April 2019.

As a Parish Council we meet the eligibility criteria to certify exemption from a limited assurance review insofar as we can confirm that:

- our gross income and expenditure for the year did not exceed £25,000
- we have been in existence since before April 2015
- there were no issues arising from the 2017/18 external audit
- and the court has not declared an item of account unlawful following any appeal under section 28(3) of the Audit & Accountability Act.

This exemption will be minuted for the public record at our May Annual Meeting . We also confirm we will comply with the exercise of public rights period as per the Accounts and Audit Regulations 2015, as we did during the summer 2018 for our 2017/18 accounts, and will publish our Certificate of Exemption along with our Annual Return on our website before 1 July 2019.
